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Being tired of the formalistic excesses of the Blob Age, the spatial concept of House I is developed by exploring the potential of Boolean operations applied on simple cubes. Along with ordinary rooms, connected by a “Promenade Architecturale” that derives from staggered stairs, the main space on ground level goes beyond the expected: L-shaped walls form a snake-shaped space that stretches from one garden to the other. The snake consists of three continuously linked areas (kitchen, dining room, living room) on slightly different levels that are lit by five windows looking towards all directions.
